## EXECUTIVE BOARD UPDATE June 19, 2024 Meeting

**Reports:** Treasurer Katherine Haff presented end-of-April financial information. Katherine also explained the upcoming regulation changes to the

Fair Labor Standards Act - which go into effect on July 1 – and how those changes might affect our employees. A Church Safety Committee report outlined tasks the group has addressed: emergency medical equipment stored in one place in the Narthex; evacuation maps to be hung in various locations throughout the church; and, locking all doors except the main entrance shortly after worship services begin.

\*\*Business items:\* A request from the Stewardship Commission for the creation of an ad hoc committee to review the Wilt estate gift was approved. A list of people representing various invested groups within the congregation was identified and the Board Chair will call the committee together as soon as possible.

A proposal from the Pastoral Ministry and Personnel Commission for the creation of an Interim Worship Planner position was approved. The Interim Worship Planner will oversee all details related to worship services throughout the Between Time – after Interim Pastor Gwen Gustafson-Zook completes her ministry with us on July 31 and before a new pastor is called.

Discussion items: Two Host City projects for Annual Conference were discussed: decorating lunch bags for Kids Food Basket is planned for the June 30 Creativity in Community Activity; collecting new bedding for Sleep in Heavenly Peace will be announced ASAP. Dates for the Annual Conference wrap-up meeting were discussed. The Gift Acceptance Policy was reviewed, and commission chairs were asked to share the info with their commissions. Planners for the Fall S/C IN District Conference (Sept. 13-14) are asking congregations to consider providing communion bread and food/craft items for the auction. More details will be provided soon. The Fall Council Meeting will be held on September 29, 2024, immediately following worship.



Join us after worship on **July 28** to celebrate Pastor Gwen's ministry among us, and send her on with blessings for the journey. Gwen will lead us in **Dances of Universal Peace** in

the narthex and then we will share fresh fruit salad and tea. Please bring cut up fruit to add to the "stone soup" salad. Cards for you to write notes of thanks and best wishes to Pastor Gwen will be available on the credenza outside the sanctuary for the next several weeks.



The Manchester Church of the Brethren has been actively involved in helping asylum-seeking people from Central and South America for the last few years. The

Immigration Support Group, with help from the church formally and many individuals within the congregation, has been assisting these asylum seekers with information, some funds, reduced rent, birthday and shower gifts, food cards, and advocacy. The church leadership and the Witness Commission have been active in assisting with support and some financial aid including grant applications.

Silvia Montecinos Alvarez and two of her young children – Cristian and Daniela – walked from Guatemala to the U.S. border and were the first immigrants to arrive here in January of 2019.

Beth Beery worked through Showing Up for Racial Justice (SURJ) to bring the family here. Silvia and the children lived with Beth Berry and Jim Bennett nearly a year before moving into their own place. Silvia received asylum just before the COVID pandemic hit. Since arriving she has had numerous jobs and added Melany and Alvaro to her family. Silvia now has her residency and Social Security number. The older children, Cristian and Daniela, are quite active in our Sunday School. Sebastian and Jhenifer Carrillo arrived in March 2022 from Colombia. They are still in the process of getting accepted for asylum but have taken steps along the way, including obtaining work permits. They have two children, Danna and Jacksen. Danna has participated intermittently in Sunday School. The Carillos came through contacts Russ and Amber Mynhier made at Unitarian Universalist's Community Accompaniment Program with Asylum-Seekers (UU CAPA) and lived at the Mynhier address for a while. The family is now living in a house they rent from the Chinworths. Sebastian and Jhenifer are both currently working. - Joel Eikenberry, Immigrant Support Group
