Many members of our congregation know part of **Denis Garcia**'s story. Denis, a trained veterinarian, is from Nicaragua and was arrested for helping



students demonstrating against the government in 2018. He spent almost 3 ½ years in prison under harsh conditions. The U.S. State Department arranged for the release of 220 political prisoners in February 2023 – including Denis. The prisoners knew nothing about the arrangements until they were taken to an airport and told they would be taken to another country. They were afraid they would be taken someplace and shot, but instead they were flown to Washington, DC. They did not know until they were on the plane that their Nicaraguan citizenship had been revoked and they would never be allowed to return. Denis loves and misses his country, especially no longer having the opportunity to even visit.

**Jeff** and **Maria Osborne** knew Denis from their work in Nicaragua as part of the Manchester University Medical Practicum. Jeff and Maria graciously sponsored Denis when he arrived in the U.S. Even though the processing for Denis' asylum was fast tracked he has not yet received his final asylum papers. He is currently working at MPS. Denis' wife, Kimberly, and their children, Keytlin and Cristopher, were left behind when Denis was flown from Nicaragua. Because of his political prisoner status there were clear pathways to apply for asylum for his immediate family. Jeff and Maria did the paperwork to sponsor them and after approval, they arrived in July 2023. Their processing is not fast tracked, but they are slowly getting through the steps toward formal asylum status. Kimberly is in the process of securing a work permit to allow formal employment. Keytlin and Cristopher, ages 9 and 12 when they arrived, excelled in the Manchester Community Schools system last year. The family is currently living in a basement apartment at the Osborne home and are actively looking for a new place to rent or buy.
