## EXECUTIVE BOARD

## BOARD UPDATE MAY 15, 2024 Meeting

REPORTS: Treasurer Katherine Haff presented the end-of-first-quarter financials which are running consistently with previous years' first quarter information. The 2024 Sing Me Home Festival dates and entertainers have been finalized and are ready to be announced publicly. The Ad Hoc Safety Planning Committee and the Nominating Committee are both actively meeting and addressing their tasks.

BUSINESS ITEMS: The EB enthusiastically requested the Moderator call a special meeting of the Council to affirm the commissioning of Karen Eberly's ministry at Timbercrest.

**DISCUSSION ITEMS:** Commission chairs are asked to review and update their commissions' job descriptions. This is an important step in assuring that commission members understand their responsibilities and tasks.

On behalf of the Stewardship Commission, Katherine Haff explained the generous gift we have been offered from Jan Wilts' estate. The discussion centered around the understanding that the gift must be considered carefully taking into consideration the parameters of the gift and how those match our Gift Acceptance Policy. Feedback and questions will be solicited from various commissions and groups within the congregation. There is no urgency or timeframe for a decision. After a thorough review, the Stewardship Commission will make a recommendation regarding the gift to the Executive Board.

Sue Mock (PMPC Chair) and Lila Hammer (EB Chair) led a discussion about possibilities for covering worship planning responsibilities in the Between Time - after Interim Pastor Gwen Gustafson-Zook's ministry with us is completed at the end of July and before a new pastor is called. The matter was referred to the Pastoral Ministry & Personnel Commission for further development, with an expectation that a proposal will be finalized at the June EB meeting.

PASTORAL SEARCH: Names of potential pastoral candidates received from the congregation have been forwarded to the District Executive. The Search Committee is finalizing interview questions and protocol in anticipation of receiving candidate profiles. From its formation in February through the submission of the Congregational Profile in April, the Search Committee had control over the timeline for completing tasks. Now...we wait...for God to speak and nudge and guide us through the next phases of the search process.


