Executive Board Update September 18, 2024 meeting

Reports: Treasurer Katherine Haff presented end-of-August financial information; spending continues to exceed contributions. However, our expenditures are running lower than the approved 2024 budget. The Commissions are doing an excellent job of keeping an eye on expenditures. The balances in both bank accounts are at levels below what is needed to cover monthly bills; the Stewardship Commission is developing a policy for withdrawing money from our Eder investment accounts to give us more liquidity for operations. The first 2024 Sing Me Home Festival event held last weekend was a huge success; the next event is on Saturday, October 19. Lila Hammer shared information about her contacts with consultants who could help us with the Envisioning Our Future process. More information is being gathered in hopes of proposing a plan to the Board in October.

Business items: A motion to authorize the Treasure to make a one-time withdrawal from the Eder short-term investment fund to populate our checking accounts was approved. A designated financial gift for the new custom-built window sills was approved. A request to allow online donations directly to On Earth Peace during the 9/28/24 concert live stream Watch Party was approved. Lists of potential candidates for openings on the Nurture, PMPC, and Fellowship Commissions were approved. Updated job descriptions for the Fellowship and Property Commissions were approved.

Discussion items: The Fellowship Commission reported on the review and revisions to 19 position descriptions within the commission! The name of the Nominating Committee candidate for the slate was announced, and the moderator reviewed the agenda for the Fall Council meeting. A request to sign as an additional party on an amicus brief in support of Apache Stronghold was brought to the Board through the Witness Commission. The Board felt this was a decision of the Council. Given the limited details provided, the Board determined the request would be brought to the Council at the 09/29/2024 meeting if sufficient information was received prior to the Fall Council meeting.
